TYPES OF SERVICE

Service, in academic terms, is usually defined as work you do for free, for pay, or in addition to your regular responsibilities. You may use your skills (related to your field) or work as a member of a committee/program/organizational structure; either type of work constitutes service.

EX:

Serving on a professional committee...

-Or-

Volunteering your time to teach adults how to read (for free)....

-or-

Helping a hospital to write grants for funding/other resources....

-or-

Being invited to write/edit documents for print/online for a stipend....

Most service is free (i.e., we used to equate service as "volunteer" work; however, some definitions of service have adapted to include certain perks in lieu of just being a volunteer. Some non-profit organizations/publishers provide benefits to volunteers, discounts, access to free resources, etc. Some non-profit organizations/publishers or others will pay for your service, usually this pay will not be what you are "really worth." Usually more time goes into this type of service than can be financially justifiable. But, pay (e.g., cash, trade, stipends, or other) can be another way of rewarding/thanking you for your work.

One thing to keep in mind: You are not supposed to make a living doing service. But, you might not receive tenure without it.

Most service is tenure-able if persistent and useful. Service that is regarded as institutional, related to a professional organization, and/or related to a community institution/organization is usually very valuable.

One thing to consider is making sure that you have useful documentation of your activities. Documentation usually belongs in tenure portfolios or should be provided to your supervisor (or both).
