

FUTURE TENSE

SIMPLE FUTURE TENSE

The simple future tense indicates an action that will occur in the future.

EX:

I will watch television.

You will watch television.

He will watch television.

She will watch television.

We will watch television.

They will watch television.

Notice that oftentimes the inclusion of the word WILL with a common verb will indicate a future tense.

FUTURE PROGRESSIVE TENSE

The future progressive tense indicates that an action is going to be happening continuously in the future (at some point).

EX:

I will be watching television.

You will be watching television.

He will be watching television.

She will be watching television.

We will be watching television.

They will be watching television.

FUTURE PERFECT TENSE

The future perfect tense indicates that an action is to be completed before another future action. The helping verb HAVE is added to the past participle to form the future perfect tense.

EX:

I will have watched television.

You will have watched television.

He will have watched television.

She will have watched television.

We will have watched television.

They will have watched television.

FUTURE PERFECT PROGRESSIVE

The future perfect progressive tense indicates that an action will be completed continuously in the future (at some point).

EX:

I will have been watching television.

You will have been watching television.

He will have been watching television.

She will have been watching television.

We will have been watching television.

They will have been watching television.
