

HOMONYMS

Homonyms are words which are spelled differently but sound the same.

The Most Commonly Confusing Homonyms include:

Affect (a verb indicating that something has been influenced or changed something)

Effect (a noun indicating the result of something or the consequence of something)

Than (a conjunction which indicates a comparison)

Then (an adverb which indicates an effect or consequence, or a change in time)

They're (the contraction for "They Are")

Their (a possessive pronoun indicating ownership of a group)

There (a preposition showing location/space)

Here (a preposition showing location/space)

Hear (a verb referring to auditory senses)

Cite (a verb indicating the use of a citation)

Sight (a noun used to indicate vision)

Site (a noun referring to a place or location)

Precede (a verb indicating to come before)

Proceed (a verb indicating to continue)

Elicit (an adjective describing something which is drawn out)

Illicit (an adjective used to describe something which is illegal)

To (a preposition)

Too (an adverb; represents the word "also")

Two (a number)

It's (the contraction for "It Is")

Its (possessive pronoun of an inanimate object)
