

SENTENCE BOXING

Similar to sentence diagramming, sentence boxing allows you to see the parts of speech in use while identifying the structural components of the sentence (e.g., subject, action, object, complements, etc.).

You use a first-tier descriptor for the part of speech. Then, you use a second-tier descriptor for the structural component.

With sentence boxing, you can be as general or specific as you want. For example, you can identify a word with a very general second-tier descriptor (object) or a very specific second-tier descriptor (Direct Object).

EX:

Patrick went running with Jennifer.

<i>word</i>	Patrick	went	running	with	Jennifer.
<i>first-tier descriptor</i>	Noun	Verb	Verb	Preposition	Noun
<i>second-tier descriptor</i>	Subject	Action	Action		Object
