2. Use a period at the end of an indirect question. An **indirect question** tells that someone asked a question, but does not give his or her exact words.

She asked if she could help him.

3. Use a period at the end of an abbreviation or an initial, after each number or letter for an item in an outline or list, between dollars and cents, and before a decimal.
